REVELATION: INTRODUCTION

Revelation 1-22

March 05, 2023

BIG IDEA: Revelation means to <u>unveil</u> or bring to light that which had been previously <u>hidden</u>.

WHEN WAS REVELATION WRITTEN?

EARLY DATE (circa 65 AD under Nero)

- "The things that must soon take place" (Revelation 1:1)
- Coming on the Clouds (Revelation 1:7)
- The Temple is still standing (Revelation 11:1-2)
- The Beast from the Sea (Revelation 17:9-10)
- Great City-Babylon/Jerusalem (Revelation 8, 10, 11, 16, 18, 19)

LATE DATE (circa 95 AD under <u>Domitian</u>)

- John's exile at Patmos (Revelation 1:9)
- Spiritual conditions of the churches (Revelation 2-3)
- "Wine and Oil" (Revelation 6:6)

HOW SHOULD REVELATION BE READ?

LINEAR (chronological)

- Revelation 1:19 lays out the outline of book
- The revealing of what is to come with each part being different and chronological leading the reader to one final climax.

SPIRAL (recapitulation)

- Revelation is divided up into seven sections
- The retelling of the same story over and over with new insights given in each movement with the climax at the end.
